Update from the ND Alumni Foundation

The landscape at 2855 Parker Street has changed forever. In fact, the school address itself will be changing to 2880 Venables St. and the excitement in the air is infectious.



After 7 years of praying, planning and persistence, the new ND Academic Wing located on the Venables side of the property is scheduled for completion and occupancy in April 2010. The next phase, scheduled for completion by the start of the 2011 school year, will provide a new connection between the upgraded gym and the upgraded Fr. Joe Cuddy Theatre. When completed, ND will be one of the largest independent educational facilities in the province.

The Notre Dame Alumni Foundation continues to support this project

ND Bridge Building Contest Celebrates 30 Years

The Balsa Bridge Building Contest has been held annually at ND since 1980. All students in Physics 11 or 12 take part, so hundreds of bridges have been tested during the contest.



For the contest, students build very light weight bridges (100-grams) made of balsa wood and glue that can support a HUGE load. The primary aim is for students to experiment with materials, and learn about structure and strength. The current record-holding bridge was built in 2000 by Physics 12 student Matt Sullivan. It held 209.4 kg (over 460 lbs)! Congratulations to Peter Vogel and all ND Physics students who have participated in the contest over the

Dear ND Alumni,

I have been an army officer in the Canadian Forces for a total of over 25 years – sometimes on part-time service, sometimes (including now) on full-time service.

Late in 2008 I was transferred from Ottawa back to British Columbia to work with the Canadian Forces' team (Joint Task Force Games) assisting the RCMP and other agencies of the Governments of Canada and BC in security and public safety for the 2010 Winter Olympic and Paralympic Games. It's been quite a challenging task but I'm confident that "Team Canada" will be primed and ready.

I am a communication and information systems specialist officer, and have had the opportunity to live and/or work in eight different provinces of Canada and to serve on a variety of missions, in Canada and abroad. Most noteworthy so far was a tour of duty with the multinational NATO Stabilization Force, conducting peace enforcement operations in Bosnia-Herzegovina, in 2002-2003.

Outside of work, I've done a fair bit of personal travel: North America and the Caribbean region, of course, as well as to South America, Europe and briefly to Africa (Morocco). It's great to be back in the vicinity of Vancouver again after living elsewhere for 20 years. My brother Bruce (ND Class of 1981), my sister (now Karen Samuels, ND Class of 1985) and their families all live in the Vancouver area. I've been the one family member leading more of a single, wayfaring lifestyle. Thankfully, I've been able to travel to attend the Class of 1980's 10th, 20th, and 25th Anniversary Reunions, and to retain a few "old school" ties to the Notre Dame community. Hopefully, I'll be able to attend some of the more regular events and my class' 30th this year.

Why "The '59ers"?

If you made a collection of all the programs of every Notre Dame Graduation Prom, you might notice a strange thing. The program for the 1959 Prom has no mention of Notre Dame and the front states simply "The '59ers May Banquet".

The drama behind this mystery began in 1958 when the class of '59 was told they would not have a Prom because of problems at one of the 1958's "aftergrads"

There are almost as many versions of that "incident" as there are for the Kennedy assassination but my favourite and the one which still makes me laugh:

One "after-grad" was held at the home of a student who just happened to live next door to the Convent of St. Francis of Assisi. You would think, knowing that they were next door to a convent, and knowing that it was a serious offense to drink, they would have been very careful. You would definitely think they would know better than to toss their empty bottles onto the convent's lawn. But that, according to my best source, is exactly what happened and what became one of the legends from early years at N.D.

Note: Did 1959 have a Prom? Yes, the parents sponsored it but Notre Dame's name could not be used, hence the 59'ers. Did we have an "after-grad"? No, much to our parents' delight.
