Blessing of the New School Building April 7, 2010

Where were you on that grey, cool day, February 11, 1953?



I know that many fellow alumni were not even a gleam in your father's eye, okay, some of you, in your grandfather's eye. I also know that some of you were with me, one of the many students from the parishes that would support and feed the brand new Notre Dame Central High School, watching His Grace, Archbishop Duke bless the Archdiocese'" pride and joy". At a recent 50th Reunion, the sentiment repeated over and over was how we wished we had been more mature and could have known. We wish we could have known then, the influence Notre Dame would have on who we would eventually be. We weren't and we didn't, but we do now.

As far as the original school is concerned, it was built at a

cost of \$238,000 and in truth was constructed along the simplest and most functional lines possible. There were no frills, not even on the Sisters' habits. For us, the first students, it was perfect. If the Archdiocese was fortunate in having the Congregation of the Sisters of Charity of Halifax staff the new school, the students were equally blest. In retrospect, I can honestly say that every student who ever passed through Notre Dame's doors "lucked out" because these Sisters would set the foundation for the future. In particular, credit must be given to Sr. Alice Michael, Notre Dame's first Principal. She was, without a doubt, an administrator "par excellence". She believed that a school should educate the whole person and with her awesome intelligence, foresight and energy, she implemented the structure on which all future Principals would build.



The 50's were the beginning56 years later, a huge new step is about to be taken.

Where will you be on April 7, 2010?

Same place, I hope; only this time with our children and their children who will be the students fortunate to enjoy this the "most expensive project ever undertaken by the Archdiocese of Vancouver".

Will they enjoy it as much as we did? I don't know but I really hope so.

Will they appreciate it as much as they should? That would be great, but not likely!

Like us, they will probably have to be a bit older to know the part this school would play in who they are.





The Class of 1959 Celebrates Their 50th Reunion

WHO KNEW?

It is twelve hours later and I can't even begin to describe the feeling. How does one adequately express the absolute joy that was our reunion? Who knew that 50 years would go by in a flash of hugs, kisses and shared memories? We expected everyone would have a great time but who could anticipate that this would barely describe the happiness that literally filled the room.

Clearly, the special bond formed through the shared experience of our school days remains as tight today as when we walked out of the doors of Notre Dame. Actually, the bond is probably tighter, because we, like normal self-centered teenagers, could not fully comprehend how much the foundation our education at Notre Dame (and our respective elementary schools) would mean to who we would eventually be as adults.



Running continually throughout the evening was a slide presentation of photos, circa 1959. Steve Dunik's complete library of 50s hits accompanied the show, adding so much to the spirit of the evening.

The buffet was perfect but the real icing on the cake was supplied by Grace Mazzucco Carter, who gave everyone a copy of the "50 year reunion memory book" she had produced. The book's cover was designed by Gerry Treger, the artist who, in 1959, designed the cover of ND's first yearbook. What more can I say: 1959's 50th reunion was everything a reunion should be and more.



Perhaps it is because the school was new and everyone knew everyone. Perhaps it's because the 50s was a great decade (Elvis!!). Whatever the reason, the Class of '59 is still, 50 years later, very much Notre Dame's Class of 1959.
