The John Brassington Memorial Endowment

Vince and Nick Zuccaro attended Notre Dame, graduating in 1969 and 1971 respectively. If it wasn't for a scholarship provided by Father Steven Gatafoni at St. Francis of Assisi Parish, neither Vince nor Nick, or their four siblings might have been able to attend Notre Dame. Thanks in part to ND, Vince and Nick have done well over the last 50 years. It is for this reason that they established the John Brassington Memorial Endowment Fund. The Fund will help one or more students per year continue at Notre Dame - students who otherwise would have to leave because of financial need. By establishing this fund, Vince and Nick hope to give others the same opportunity they had 50 years ago.

John Brassington was a classmate and a teammate of Vince's – that famous 1968 team that was just inducted into the BC Football Hall of Fame. John taught and coached at Notre Dame for 40 years and was taken away from us in 2016 in an unfortunate car accident.

Vince and Nick established the fund with an initial \$50,000. At an interest rate of about

5%. and with an additional \$4,000 from annual fundraising events, they hope that the principal can be maintained. Last year the fund was used to cover the tuition for one student who otherwise would have left the school to go elsewhere. With more fundraising, the goal is to grow the principal to \$100K giving the endowment enough to provide




Pub Night 2019 Success

Sister Katherine Nickerson R. I. P.

The Notre Dame community mourns the passing of Sister Katherine, former principal of the school. Sister, then known as Sister Catherine Josephine, was appointed principal in 1968, soon establishing herself as a kind woman who really did not enjoy having to be a disciplinarian. Any student sent to her office was as likely to leave with candy in hand rather any punishment. Her gentle concern for all her charges rapidly resulted in her being dubbed "Katy Joe", by which soubriquet many still fondly remember her.

Sister, a true realist who understood the changing times, was also the perfect person to preside over the transition from Notre Dame being staffed largely by the Sisters of Charity of Halifax, to one staffed by lay people - a realistic view of the changes that were taking place in the Church as fewer and fewer responded to the call of a religious vocation. Thus it was that she cheerfully assumed the role of Vice-Principal in 1972, with Al Blesch being appointed Principal. In the role of Vice Principal. Sister, now having returned to her original name of Katherine Nickerson, continued to act as Vice Principal until 1990, still exerting her gentle role as mentor and guide to the students. cheerfully and enthusiastically supporting them in all their endeavours and happily encouraging the lay staff as they continued to try to emulate the marvellous work that the Sisters had begun.

Many former staff and students happily remember the Sisters, regretting that by the time Sister Katherine retired few of the Order remained in the school, a school which would not have existed but for the dedication of the Sisters of Charity. Of course, even after retirement, Sister Katherine continued her enthusiastic role as a teacher and, as a member of St. Mary's Parish. There she took up residence and continued to work in the RCIA program until even she had to acknowledge the passing years, at which point she returned to the Mother House in Halifax, where she lived until her recent passing on February 15th at the age of 94.

She continued until the end to be a long-distance supporter of the school and always took an interest in all that happened to the community. Sister Katherine was a truly caring and loving representative of her Order and will long be fondly remembered by the many who had the good fortune to have known her and worked with her. Thank-you, Katherine, for all that you have done for Notre Dame!

Snail Mail or E-Mail?

For many years, the main vehicle for transmitting Alumni news to former Notre Dame students was a newsletter, sent by "snail mail". This was costly. As technology improved, the Executive was deluged with requests that the newsletter be sent via e-mail, since this would be cheaper and more environmentally friendly. The Executive

appreciated the benefits of such a move and complied so that the Alumni Newsletter is now sent out by e-mail. There was, however, a problem in that few alumni bothered to send in their e-mail address. The result was that circulation dropped from almost 3,000 to about 1000.

At the same time, the Association experienced a considerable decline in revenue. The most recent appeal for alumni to renew their membership (annual fee: \$20.00) resulted in a total of about twenty complying. The executive is grateful for this support – particularly to those who sent in extra money to make up for "back payments"!

The Executive realizes that most alumni would quite happily pay the membership fee if approached directly and could hand the money over immediately; as it is, despite their good will, they just don't get round to it – understandable in today's busy and electronic world.
