Class of 1969 Reunion





One question that came up on repeat was "has it really been 20 years?" - You would not guess it as we all aged quite well over the past 20 years.

It truly seemed like yesterday when we were focused on homework, dating, getting our driver's license and when the next school dance was. Now twenty years later the focus turned to gas or electric vehicles, changing diapers, where to preregister for school 5 years in advance, buying expensive real estate far from where we grew up, all while holding down a job instead of a career with the changing landscape in the economy.



We had many who couldn't attend due to child sporting commitments, baby showers and holidays, such as Mike Tempesta and Jessica Gibson, both '99 grads, who were celebrating their wedding while away on the Amalfi Coast in Italy. True love does find its way back around and they are just one example of '99 grads who stuck in out through their High School young love days.

It was a pleasure working with Lana (Manderscheid) Piovesan getting this get-together planned as she was instrumental in getting people involved! Lana had to work some serious social media/computer stalking magic! We have already been tasked with suggestions for a 25th and 30th reunion, which sounds like it could be more of an all-night party.

We still miss the days of walking the halls and getting to see your friends on a daily basis. Now it's more along the lines of planning 2 months in advance around sports, work and children schedules just to get together for a BBQ in a 3 hour window. Lastly, some fun facts from 1999 and 2019.

Gas was .35/.40 cents instead of \$1.50/1.60. Throwing \$2.00-\$5.00 in your beater car got you to school and around at lunch almost all week.

We primarily used pagers but few had Nokia's or Motorola flip phones instead of the iPhone/ Galaxy used today.

We called stationary house phones to hang out after school hours, quite different today with kids in Elementary school having their own mobile phones.

Taking pictures consisted of buying film and using an actual camera, then developing them to see how they turned out.

Recycling and environmental care happened back then, but not even close to how it does today. Hopefully this gets even better as time goes on. The Sedin twins from the Canucks got drafted in 1999 and this year in 2019 get their jerseys retired as two of the all-time greats in Canuck history.

American Pie was our grad of '99 movie and Fast and The Furious just came out that summer. Now today there have been nine 'Fast and the Furious' and eight 'American Pie' movies.

You could eat any meal at McDonald's for under \$5.00 tax included, plus save even more on specialty days. Now today it's about double that price.

Same thing can be said for .05 cent candies from the store, which don't exist anymore under .15-30 cents each.

Gas powered cars tended to top out at about 250-275 horse power back then, now they reach and sell off the lot with up to 600 horse power. Electric vehicles staying surprisingly comparable with the Tesla, putting out a whopping 503 horse power — "that isn't no sewing machine".

Lastly, buying a detached home in Vancouver/Burnaby went for about \$350,000, now today worth about a million dollars for the same house without many upgrades. My one tip, ***BUY REAL ESTATE NOW***

John Brassington Endowment Fund

My brother Nick and I set up an endowment fund last year. Both of us attended Notre Dame for our high school education. I graduated in 1969 and Nick in 1971. If it weren't for a scholarship provided by Father Steven Gatafoni at St. Francis of Assisi Parish I probably would not have been able to attend Notre Dame. Nick, who would have followed, probably would not have been able to attend Notre Dame either. It is for this reason that Nick and I have started this Endowment fund to help one or two students per

year stay at Notre Dame who otherwise would have to leave because of financial need. The fund was named after John Brassington. John was a classmate and a teammate of mine – that famous 1968 team that just got inducted into the BC Football Hall of Fame in 2018. John taught and coached at Notre Dame for 40 years and was taken away from us in 2016 in an unfortunate car accident.

Nick and I have done well over the last 50 years and we have to thank in part the years we spent at Notre Dame. We thought that helping a student or more every year attend Notre Dame would give them the same opportunity we had 50 years ago.

We started the fund with \$50K and would like at least that amount to continue for many years. With investment income of about 5% and about \$4K from fundraising events like this one we can maintain the principle amount. Last year we were able to fund the tuition of one student who had another sibling start at Notre Dame who otherwise would have been taken out of here and gone elsewhere.

It would be great to get this fund up to \$100K. That would give the endowment fund the ability to provide funding for 2, 3, or 4 students per year for many years to come.

It is to this end that I urge everyone here to donate to the John Brassington Endowment fund every year. No amount is too small. In order to get a tax receipt from the Alumni Foundation the minimum is \$20. But if you can afford to put in \$50, or \$100 or more per year that would be fantastic.

Any amount would be appreciated. This can be done on line. Please donate to the Notre Dame Foundation and earmark it for the John Brassington Memorial Endowment Fund. This can be done through the ND Alumni website through the donate button and making a note that the donation is for the JB Endowment fund.
