# **43rd Annual Physics Bridge Building Contest**

Recently we held the 43rd annual Physics Balsa Bridge Building Contest, nowadays slightly

rebranded with the name of its founder. Widely sponsored, the contest has become known for its dramatic testing of bridges in the ND Auditorium. It has also become known for a livestream with play-by-play of bridge testing that has run since the early days of the internet.

This year's event had a big finish as Adriano Pizzolato's high-arch structure blew past 200 kilos on its way to a finish that placed it third-strongest of all out of the nearly two thousand bridges tested over more



than four decades. Adriano's father, Michael Pizzolato, was a contest winner all the way back in 1987, with a bridge supporting just over 106 kilos.

Given that this year's win brings to four the number of Pizzolato victories, it is fair to say this marks the second dynasty for the contest, equalling the four successive top place finishes by the two Circo brothers more than a decade ago.
